

Emergency Preparedness



Prepare, Plan, and Pack

Emergency situations can happen at any time, and at any place. Whether natural or man-made, these emergency situations can result in damage to property and endanger the health and safety of the general public.

Guam regularly experiences natural disasters such as typhoons and earthquakes. Fires, flooding, and disasters from hazardous materials are other occurrences that may endanger you and your property.

Prepare Basic Supplies

In the event of an emergency, you should be prepared to be self-sufficient for up to seven days. Preparing and maintaining an emergency supply of essential items can help ensure that you have adequate supplies to meet you and your family's needs until help arrives.

Basic emergency supplies include:

- One week supply of canned and dried food items
- Drinking water – at least one gallon per person per day
- Flashlights and extra batteries
- Battery operated radio
- First Aid kit
- Whistle
- 10 - 30 day supply of medications
- Toilet tissue and personal hygiene supplies
- Water for flushing toilet in the event water is shut off
- Trash bags, gloves, duct tape or masking tape, and plastic containers for storing items
- Chlorine bleach for sanitizing
- Propane stove and extra propane gas

Make a Plan

Emergency preparedness also means making a plan.

Your plan should:

- Designate a place to meet if you and your family are separated from each other.
- Pick a primary and alternate contact number for you and your family to call if you are separated from each other.
- Establish a buddy system with other family members, friends, neighbors, or co-workers, and develop a plan on how you can help each other.
- Share your plan and your emergency contact list with members in your buddy system.
- Make a plan on how to secure your house in case you are not home or you are otherwise unable to secure your home.
- Identify another place to go to in case you need to evacuate.
- Establish your primary and alternate evacuation routes.
- If you use mobility aids, plan on how to take them with you and how to store extra aids at your alternate shelter, if possible.

Pack a GO-KIT (Disaster Supply Kit)

You should prepare a bag with your most essential items which you can grab if an emergency situation occurs, and you need to evacuate right away. Be sure the bag is not too heavy for you or someone to carry.

Your emergency go-kit should include:

- List of contact numbers
- Dried foods and bottled water
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Whistle
- Small portable radio and extra batteries
- Basic toiletries and sanitary items
- Medications
- Important documents, including medical information

It is a good idea to:

- Place your bag near an entry or exit way so it can easily be carried out.
- Put reminder notices in your calendar or appointment book to check and replace items in your bag at least every 6 months.
- Let people in your buddy system know where your GO-KIT is located.

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Health Services

Tips for Families

- Eat foods that are good for you – vegetables, fruits, grains, and dairy foods.
- Get daily exercise – walk with your baby, play outside with your toddler or preschooler.
- NEVER shake your baby! Don't throw your baby, even if you are playing, as this may cause the brain to swell, bleed or bruise which can cause blindness, seizures, mental retardation, other disabilities, or even death.
- Arrange for your child to receive regular check-ups and scheduled immunizations.
- If you call your doctor's office/clinic, be sure to get the name of the person you speak with in case you need to call back or if questions come up.
- Ask the clinic if they accept walk-ins and if there are any payments to be made up-front.
- Be sure to verify the type of insurance (including Medicaid), the doctor/clinic will accept.
- Ask what types of payment are accepted – cash, check, credit card.
- Make sure you have the needed documents to help get the most out of your child's visit – shot records, medical history, medications (type and dosage), insurance, guardianship, etc.

Tips for Families

- When choosing a child care center, cost should not be the only consideration: think of health and safety, trained and loving teachers, toys and materials that are educational and appropriate for your child's age.
- Anyone can love a child who is easy to take care of and is in a good mood. Look at how a person handles a crying, tantruming child. Notice whether the caregiver responds with love, patience, and positive, calm words, or with harsh and unrespectful words, and action.
- Take time each day to talk with your child's teacher. You are partners in providing the highest quality of care and education.
- A high quality child care center will help your child learn about himself, his feelings, other people, communication, physical movement, and thinking skills.

MODEL CHILD CARE CENTERS

There are thirteen (13) Model Child Care Centers in Guam recognized by the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS), Division of Public Welfare, Child Care & Development Fund Program (CCDF) and the University of Guam Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities Education, Research, and Service (Guam CEDDERS). These centers receive up to 85% reimbursements in child care tuition for eligible families and have received mini-grants to help supplement their resources and meet the accessibility requirements under the Americans with Disabilities Act.

The Model Child Care Center Program is part of a Quality Rating System where child care centers are taking action steps to provide child care services that exceed the DPHSS requirements for licensure. Training and technical assistance are provided to these centers by Guam CEDDERS that focus on developmentally appropriate practices, including children with disabilities, health and safety compliance, early learning guidelines with standards, recognized curriculum, assessment program, and family partnerships.

The centers with the Model Child Care Center Logo in this section have earned the designation of being a Model Child Care Center.


