

This directory will help provide the user with some guidance in finding contact information on services for young children in the areas of health and educational services and family supports.

Each year, early childhood programs gather information and update the directory of service providers to ensure that contact information is accurate for early childhood services that are available on our island. The Guam Early Learning Council (GELC) and Project Tinituhon, activities

facilitated by the University of Guam Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities Education, Research, and Service (Guam CEDDERS), spearheaded the process of updating this directory. However, an undertaking of this magnitude must have strong partnerships to make it the best it can be. These partners include the Department of Education, Division of Special Education, Guam Early Intervention System, Preschool Program, and Head Start Program; Project Kariñu and Project Bisita I Familia, under the Department of Public Health and Social Services; Catholic Social Services and Guam's Positive Parents Together, a non-profit organization run by parents. We are especially grateful to Project Kariñu for providing funding support to print the actual hard copies of the Directory. In addition, this reference is available on the GELC website at www.guamelc.org.

We are excited to provide you with the fifth edition of this community resource and continue to work hard on making it available to families with children under eight years of age. It is our aim to make copies available at all early childhood programs and organizations, as well as at community outreach events for young children. Emergency Preparedness



Prepare, Plan, and Pack

Emergency situations can happen at any time, and at any place. Whether natural or man-made, these emergency situations can result in damage to property and endanger the health and safety of the general public.

Guam regularly experiences natural disasters such as typhoons, earthquakes, and floods. Fires and disasters from hazardous materials are other occurrences that may endanger you and your property.

Prepare Basic Supplies

In the event of an emergency, you should be prepared to be self-sufficient for up to seven days. Preparing and maintaining an emergency supply of essential items can help ensure that you have adequate supplies to meet you and your family's needs until help arrives.

Basic emergency supplies include:

- One week supply of canned and dried food items
- Drinking water at least one gallon per person per day
- Flashlights and extra batteries
- Battery operated radio
- First Aid kit
- Whistle
- 10 30 day supply of medications and medical supplies
- · Toilet tissue and personal hygiene supplies
- · Water for flushing toilet in the event water is shut off
- Trash bags, gloves, duct tape or masking tape, and plastic containers for storing items
- · Chlorine bleach for sanitizing
- Propane stove and extra propane gas

Emergency Preparedness

Make a Plan and Practice your Plan

Emergency preparedness also means making a plan.

Your plan should:

- Designate a place to meet if you and your family are separated from each other.
- Pick a primary and alternate contact number for you and your family to call if you are separated from each other.
- Establish a buddy system with other family members, friends, neighbors, or co-workers, and develop a plan on how you can help each other.
- Share your plan and your emergency contact list with members in your buddy system.
- Make a plan on how to secure your house in case you are not home or you are otherwise unable to secure your home.
- Identify another place to go to in case you need to evacuate.
- Establish your primary and alternate evacuation routes.
- If you use mobility aids, plan on how to take them with you and how to store extra aids at your alternate shelter, if possible.

Pack a GO-KIT (Disaster Supply Kit)

You should prepare a bag with your most essential items which you can grab if an emergency situation occurs, and you need to evacuate right away. Be sure the bag is not too heavy for you or someone to carry.

Your emergency GO-KIT should include:

- List of contact numbers
- Dried foods and bottled water
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Whistle
- · Small portable radio and extra batteries
- Basic toiletries and sanitary items
- Medications and medical supplies
- Important documents, including medical information

It is a good idea to:

- · Place your bag near an entry or exit way so it can easily be carried out.
- Put reminder notices in your calendar or appointment book to check and replace items in your bag at least every 6 months.
- Let people in your buddy system know where your GO-KIT is located.

Health Services

Tips for Families

- Eat foods that are good for you vegetables, fruits, grains, and dairy foods.
- Get daily exercise walk with your baby, play outside with your toddler or preschooler.
- NEVER shake your baby! Don't throw your baby, even if you are playing, as this may cause the brain to swell, bleed, or bruise which can cause blindness, seizures, intellectual disability, other disabilities, or even death.
- Arrange for your child to receive regular check-ups and scheduled immunizations.
- If you call your doctor's office/clinic, be sure to get the name of the person you speak with in case you need to call back or if questions come up.
- Ask the clinic if they accept walk-ins and if there are any payments to be made up front.
- Be sure to verify the type of insurance (including Medicaid), the doctor/clinic will accept.
- Ask what types of payment are accepted cash, check, and/or credit card.
- Make sure you have the necessary documents to help get the most out of your child's visit shot records, medical history, medications (type and dosage), insurance, quardianship, etc.


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Tips for Families



HELPFUL TIPS IN USING INTERPRETER SERVICES*

- Address comments to the individual. Not only is this a sign of respect, the person may actually
 understand more than he/she conveys.
- Do not direct comments to interpreter as this ignores the individual and makes him/her feel discounted
- Allow interpreter to use cultural norms in conveying message, communication styles
- Speak slowly and allow interpreter to translate every few sentences
- Ask for clarification to make sure information is conveyed and received accurately
- Do not assume if person nods in agreement or says yes that he/she understands what was said
- Own problem of communication; do not blame the individual you are serving.
- Allow interpreter to use cultural norms in conveying message, communication styles
- Clarify if person understands what has been said
- Review proceedings with interpreter in advance so he/she is familiar with your expectations of interview, evaluation, etc.
- Debrief with interpreter to see if there is information that needs to be clarified or may have been communicated non-verbally by individual.
- Allow for extra time

Linguistically Competent Practice:

- Use only trained interpreters to ensure accurate communication
- Prohibit use of minor children as interpreters
- Determine verbal, reading and writing proficiency of your interpreters

What an Interpreter is NOT:

- A Mental Health Clinician, therapist or diagnostician
- They should not be placed in the position of making clinical decisions
- They are not just a "dictionary", i.e., they also bring invaluable cultural expertise to the sessions
